4.	Commodore's Report	Sally Taylor thanked everyone on the committee and members for their support this year. She said the weather was to blame for people not being down on their boats very often this year which had a knock on effect on the club. However, there was a good turnout at all the events and she wanted to thank the committee for all their hard work throughout this year. She also went on to thank Dave Sinclair for being Social Secretary for the last five years and said he had done a great job and had introduced some great acts to the club. 6.	Social Secretary's Report	Dave Sinclair wanted to thank everyone for attending the events this year. He said that the Jubilee weekend was well supported despite the bad weather. Gaps were left in the event programme for members to fill if they wanted. Clive Russell organised a rock band night with Soul Weaver and Brian Dobson and Walter Bailey put on an Ibiza night. Dave said that we could put on events every week but it was hard work for the committee and he felt that the formula of putting one big event on a month had worked over the past two years. Forms for New Event Ideas were handed out and it is hoped that members will suggest new ways of entertainment next year and possibly run the evening themselves. Finally, Dave thanked Tony/Paul for the donation of a plasma TV which had been put to good use during rainy days!

7.	Membership Secretary's Report	 Even though the weather was horrendous for boating at the beginning of the year we still managed 94 members including 4 Honorary members and 9 members who joined right at the end of the season so had free membership. That is 85 paid up members. Membership fees received £1275. This is £262.50 down on 2011 when we had 120 members including 12 honorary members, 1 half membership and 4 free (those who joined at the end of the season). That made a total of 104 paid up members, 19 more than this year. Membership fees received £1537.50. The discrepancy with the honorary members is that 8 of the honorary members did not apply to renew their membership this year. Over the year we have seen 30 new boaters join which is excellent and bodes well for a good year next year when we hope the weather will improve.
